
WASHINGTON INTERNSHIPS FOR STUDENTS OF ENGINEERING (WISE)

Deadline for applications is February 8th

Founded in 1980 through the collaborative efforts of several professional engineering societies, the Washington Internship for Students of Engineering (WISE), has become one of the premier Washington internship programs. Its goal is to groom future leaders of the engineering profession who are aware of and can contribute to the important intersections of technology and public policy.

Each summer, ASHRAE's Government Affairs Office hosts an outstanding engineering student or recent graduate to spend ten weeks in Washington, D.C. as part of this program. During the internship, the selected student will join 12-15 of their peers (sponsored by other organizations) to learn how government officials make decisions on complex technological issues and how engineers can contribute to legislative and regulatory public policy decisions. The students then write an in-depth research paper on a relevant technology issue and assess potential policy responses.
