What Will Happen to the Olympic Village After the Paris 2024 Games Are Over?

During the Olympics and Paralympics, the Olympic Village will accommodate approximately 14,250 and 8,000 athletes, respectively. Located in the Seine-Saint-Denis area, this former industrial site is transforming into a vibrant, eco-friendly neighborhood that will leave a lasting legacy of environmental stewardship and community integration. The Village's significance lies in its post-Games transformation, slated for completion by 2025. This ambitious phase will evolve the area into a fully-fledged sustainable city district featuring 2,500 new homes, including student residences and social housing. Central to its design are green spaces encompassing a 7.5-acre landscaped park and 17 acres of gardens, promoting [biodiversity](#) and enhancing the quality of urban life. [Read more](#)
